
And it is of course the membership, in particular the volunteers, who have made the difference, determined to put on a good service for our visitors and not let pandemic fears get the upper hand. Well done all!



More activity on the new access coach, as Glenn fits the frame for one of the

fourteen clerestory windows. Below, nestling safely in the corner of the workshop are a set of historic coach doors, salvaged from the Padarn Railway. This was a 4ft-gauge railway built to carry slate the 7 miles from the Dinorwic Quarry in North Wales to the harbour at Port Dinorwic on the Menai Strait. From there the slate was exported all over the world.

The Llanberis Lake Railway now runs along part of the Padarn Railway trackbed. Their three Hunslet steam engines worked at Dinorwic, as did our own Hunslet Irish Mail and Bagnall Sybil. The Padarn doors, spotted on an auction site by a sharp-eyed West Lancs member, will be used as templates to make the new doors for the access coach. How the world turns!





As one Jeeves and Wooster character was wont to say, 'The future is ahead of us!' Sybil will certainly be a big part of our future as the loco moves from the restoration phase towards operation. But what else? Now that we own our land, we can start to think strategically about developing the Railway in the next few years. 
