

The crowds were out on a sunny Teddy Bears Day, with lots of visitors coming to ride the trains and meet our bears.






Some bears really enjoy interacting with our visitors.....other bears are a bit shy.


Domestic harmony on a footplate! Father and son Spall take Sybil for an afternoon run.

Montalban was busy too, with driver Andy and blockman Alan exchanging the token before entering Becconsall.




And after so much activity Mr Strawbs and Barry take a well-deserved rest.
